**USING OUR NEW ELWS**

In our new hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, the authors have provided us with ten different settings of the liturgy. These settings reflect a wide variety of styles which reclaim the best of our past while celebrating the richness of the present.

Throughout the upcoming church year, we will utilize a number of these different settings at the 8:00 and 9:30 services. Beginning in Advent and continuing through Epiphany, we will use Setting One. This will be familiar to the congregation, as it is the first setting out of the ELW we used here at Zion.

During the season of Lent the congregation will learn Setting Five. Setting Five is a dark, chant-style setting which provides a beautiful backdrop for many of the themes of Lent. Our mid-week Lenten services features the Vespers liturgy. The Vespers liturgy, with an emphasis on Jesus Christ as our eternal light, is specifically written for early evening prayer services.

On Easter morning we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord with Setting Three. This setting will be familiar to most of the congregation, as it is identical to Setting One from The Lutheran Book of Worship, or as many call it, the green hymnal. Holy Trinity Sunday worship starts us off with Setting Ten, which brings in familiar hymn tunes as a basis for the liturgy.

Using and learning a variety of liturgies will help to enrich and focus our worship around Word and sacrament, keeping our worship fresh and alive in the name of Jesus Christ. To God be the Glory!

## INTERNATIONAL MISSION TRIP 2010: RWANDA

*Go therefore and make disciples of all nations . . . Matthew 28:19*

In June of 2009, a team of fifteen headed to Honduras for Zion's first international mission trip and the transformation that took place within the congregation and in the hearts of each person on that team was overwhelming! Now it's time to put together Zion's second international mission trip to Rwanda! While in Rwanda, we will be doing a variety of ministry projects possibly including, but not limited to: construction work, holding Bible studies under trees for street kids, ministering to widows, working on economic development, as well as doing reconciliation ministry for people and learning the political climate of Rwanda since the genocide. Specific projects are to be determined at a later date. In addition, we'll take one day to see the country, maybe go on an African safari.

The exact dates of the trip are still being determined but will likely take place in September or October 2010. Children ages nine years and up are welcome to be a part of this mission team if accompanied by a parent. The trip itself will be 10-12 days, costing between \$2,000-\$2,500. That includes all transportation, food, lodging, water, tours, and insurance. Part of the monthly preparation leading up to the trip once the team is put in place includes raising mission support for the trip, so do not let the cost of the trip inhibit your interest.

Grace Spell, WIM Missionary Leader along with Pastor Jennifer will be hosting an interest meeting on Sunday, January 17 at 5:00pm in Zion's Baby Nursery/Conference Room. Following that meeting, we will begin receiving applications along with the \$100 non-refundable application fee. Come find out more, and discern through thought and prayer if this is something God is calling you to do. And I promise you, your life with God will be transformed!
