ZION HISTORY NOTES

There are now seven Elementary Schools in Northside Independent School District named for present or former members of Zion Lutheran Church of Helotes. Clarence Galm was a member of the first School Board and was on the committee who worked hard to create NISD. Due to his efforts Northside High School, now called John Marshall High School, was established. Before that anyone who wanted to go to high school had to attend Jefferson High School, or another school of their choice, in San Antonio. Mr. Galm was a lifelong member of Zion and is buried in Zion Cemetery.

Henry Brauchle was a longtime teacher at the private Helotes School before NISD was founded. He was a community leader, a charter member of Zion, and is buried in Zion Cemetery.

Henry Steubing Jr. was a member of the first school board to form the first public school in the area called Leon Valley Elementary. The school building still stands at the corner of Bandera and Grissom Roads. Henry Steubing was a member of Zion and his father was a charter member. He is buried in Zion Cemetery.

Dr. W. Z. Burke was a local veterinarian who assisted the many dairy farmers in this area and was a member of the first School Board of NISD. He was a member of Zion for several years and is buried in New Braunfels.

Paul Ott, a long time active member of Zion, was the head of the NISD Maintenance Department for many years during extensive district growth. He is buried in Zion Cemetery.

BEGINNING NEXT MONTH...

Changes are in store for Zion’s monthly newsletter. Upcoming events and specific needs at Zion will be the priority for publication. Detailed articles about special events will also be included. Cards and letters and member milestones will continue as before.

Reviews of past events will no longer be published, nor will ads for non-Zion activities. Publicity requests from other churches and local groups will be reviewed by the staff and posted on the kiosk in the narthex if appropriate.

Each issue will still be available in the narthex for you to pick up after worship, usually on the last Sunday of the month. Monthly calendars will be available separately, for pickup throughout the month. Weekly calendars are published in the Sunday bulletins. The interactive calendar on the website offers an e-mail reminder function, plus downloading to your own calendar program (ie Outlook).

A condensed publication offers several advantages:

- Fewer pages means fewer trees used.
- The March newsletter cost nearly \$200 to mail. A smaller size publication gets a lower postage rate; nearly half the cost for most addresses.
- More staff time will be available for website and on-line calendar updates.

You can completely eliminate your postage expense by subscribing to the on-line version of the newsletter. You’ll receive an e-mail when each issue is posted on the web. You can still pick up a paper copy from the narthex if you like.

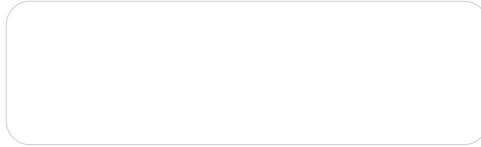
