INTERN ARRIVES IN AUGUST

On Sunday, August 23, meet and greet Neil Cadle, Zion's new intern. Receptions will follow both the 8:00 and 9:30 services, or bring a dish to share at the potluck luncheon at noon in the Family Life Center.

For many of us, this may be the first time we have worked with an intern, so the Internship Committee offers:

10 Steps for Neil's Success

- 1. Tell Neil your name each time you meet him for at least the first three months - he's meeting a lot of new people!
2. Remember that Neil is leaving friends and adjusting to new surroundings.
3. Get to know Neil by inviting him to your home - and better yet, share a meal!
4. The seminary looks to Pastor Dave to serve as Neil's supervisor. Requests for his services should be cleared through him. While Neil can't be expected to do everything anyone might suggest, invitations for his involvement are always appropriate.
5. Neil is a unique person - we shouldn't assume that he will do the same things in the same way as our pastors. Accept Neil as he is and remember that we are apt to change the most when we know ourselves to be loved just as we are.
6. Remember that Neil is a student who comes as a learner/server. Though doing pastoral functions, he is not yet ordained to the pastoral office. The title of Intern is most appropriate for his role and position.
7. Defend Neil's freedom. Help him to be free to grow, free to feel, free to fail. Expect him to neither be controversial nor to avoid controversial matters.
8. Support the lay Internship committee, but don't expect them to fulfill the congregation's total responsibilities to Neil. Work with them in whatever ways they request or you deem appropriate.
9. Remember: Neil is entitled to our understanding and loyalty.
10. Pray for Neil.

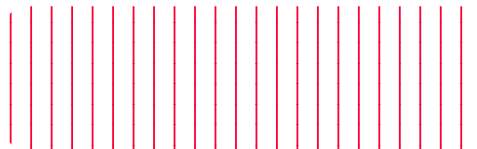
